

# JORDAN KUPHALDT MEMORIAL 2025 SCHOLARSHIP



The **SUTTER YUBA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION** invites applicants to apply for the Jordan Kuphaldt Memorial Scholarship. This is a one-time \$2,000 award to be granted to a graduating high school senior who plans to attend trade school or college. Known as “Kooph” by many of his peers, Jordan was a 2015 graduate of Yuba City High School. Although he was a standout athlete in both Tennis and Football, he will be remembered most for his strong work ethic and his positive, encouraging, and selfless demeanor. The scholarship committee will be considering all extracurricular activities, including work experience, community service involvement, school leadership, athletics, as well as financial responsibility.

## ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the scholarship, student applicants must

- 1) Be a graduating senior at Yuba City High School,
- 2) Plan to attend trade school, college, or continuing education,
- 3) Maintain an overall 2.0 GPA.

**ESSAY**

- A. Type (font size 12, double spaced) or write legibly an essay regarding your educational and career goals. Include reasons for your choice of school, area of major and a statement of how any scholarship funds received would be used in reaching your stated goals.
- B. Clearly state your personal financial responsibility and your family’s ability to assist financially in your education. 500 words maximum. Be concise and thorough. List any other financial aid you are receiving.

**PROOF OF ACCEPTANCE** to a trade school or 2- or 4-year college or university required to receive funding

**RESUME *will be considered by not required***

Including all extracurricular and co-curricular activities for the past 4 years, broken down by year. Include employment, community service, sports, awards, and leadership positions. Include the number of hours/days served for volunteer work and or employment.
