The **SUTTER YUBA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION** invites applicants to apply for the Sarah Jackson Memorial Scholarship. This is a one-time \$500 award to be granted to a graduating high school senior who plans to attend college and major in Education, English, or Liberal Studies.

Sarah E. Jackson taught English and Business courses at Yuba City High School from September 1978 until her retirement in June 1992. Her love of teaching was a driving force in her life, second only to her love of family. Those students who were privileged to learn under Sarah's direction readily acknowledge the positive impact she had on their lives.

## ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the scholarship, student applicants must

1. Be a graduating senior at a high school in the Sutter-Yuba area.
2. Plan to major in Education, English, or Liberal Studies at college.
3. Maintain a 2.3 GPA overall, and
4. Show proof of acceptance to a 2- or 4- year college or university

**TRANSCRIPT** Include a copy of your high school transcripts.

**ESSAY**

- A. Type (font size 12, double spaced) or write legibly an essay regarding your educational and career goals. Include reasons for your choice of training program, area of speciality and a statement of how any scholarship funds received would be used in reaching your stated goals.
- B. Clearly state your personal financial responsibility and your family's ability to assist financially in your education. 500 words maximum. Be concise and thorough. List any other financial aid you are receiving.

**PROOF OF ACCEPTANCE** to a 2- or 4- year college or university.

**RESUME**

Including all extracurricular and co-curricular activities for the past 4 years, broken down by year. Include employment, community service, sports, awards, and leadership positions. Include the number of hours/days served for volunteer work and or employment.
